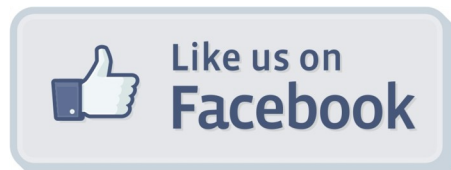

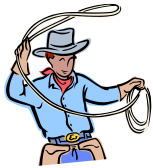

Guidelines for Dress Up Days

General school dress code guidelines apply at all times.

Students may wear moderate jewelry as accessories for dress up days.

Hats or baseball caps that are not too big that are part of the special dress day may be worn. Students may be asked to remove hats during class.

Students may wear shorts as part of the dress up days provided that they are modest and are no shorter than mid-thigh or fingertip length at the shortest side of shorts (whichever is longer). (Volleyball shorts are too short.) Wearing tights underneath shorts, while perhaps improving modesty, does not negate following the length requirement.

Dresses or skirts may be no shorter than 2 inches above the knee. (Normal dress code)

Dress should not be tight, see-through, or low-cut.

Dress should not expose any part of the midriff.

Dress should not expose any part of the back.

Tank tops are not allowed.

Strapless or sleeveless tops/shirts/dresses are not allowed.

Students may be asked to remove any large or distracting accessories during class.

Flip-flops are not to be worn for safety reasons.

Points for Class Competitions

The highest number of points will be awarded to the class with the highest percentage of participation for the given dress days.

The highest number of points will be awarded to winners of class games.

Points will be awarded to classes finishing in 2nd, 3rd, and 4th places.

Points will be awarded to students wearing regular school spirit dress on any given day.

Points will be awarded for wearing homecoming shirts to activities.

Points will be awarded for attendance at any school games October 10-14.

Students who do not comply with dress guidelines may be asked to go home to change or to find something appropriate to wear from the Eagle Shop.

The administration reserves the right to judge the appropriateness of any student's dress.
